CEMETERY CONSULTATION

Following notification that the Parish Council is planning essential maintenance of the cemetery and a reminder of the regulations that apply to the graveyard, a public consultation was requested. This was held on Monday, 20th April at the Gardiner Memorial Hall. A number of parish councillors were in attendance to listen and receive concerns and wishes from users of the graveyard.

Following a very positive response, the Parish Council would like to extend the consultation for a number of weeks so that further views can be collected; in particular in relation to the regulations that govern the graveyard. If you have any comments about the Ness Road cemetery please contact the Parish Clerk.

During May, the Parish Council will undertake essential maintenance, including turfing and re-seeding of graves, in areas that are accessible.

Users of Jubilee Green may have noticed that the goal posts have been re-erected following reseeding of the grass and maintenance of the posts.


Following feedback from residents and youth groups in the village, the
